Residents may take their real Christmas tree to the City brush pile after your season festivities. Please remove all decorations before disposal.

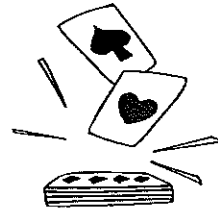
Snowmobile Warning

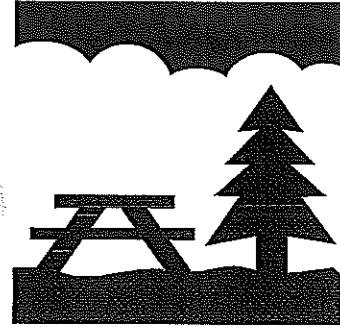
Library Book Discussion

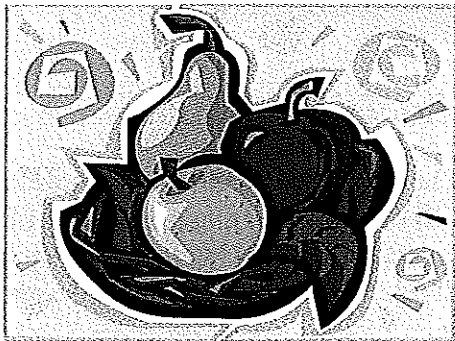
2012 RESERVATIONS AVAILABLE NOW
