We have explored a number of options but based on a variety of factors including health and safety, staffing concerns, and the current restrictions, the decision has been made to not open this summer. We understand what an important part of summer pools play for families, and this decision was not made lightly. Mosquito Spraying Notice

The Glidden Public Works Department will spray for mosquitoes as necessary, weather permitting, until the mosquito season comes to an end. In order for a successful application to be applied, the wind speed must be less than 10 mph and there can be no threat of rain two hours after the application. All individuals can contribute to mosquito control by eliminating breeding habitats, reduce standing water, and control the early stages of the mosquito by applying pesticides around your property.

People who are concerned about exposure to a pesticide, such as those with chemical sensitivity or breathing conditions such as asthma, can reduce their potential for exposure by staying indoors during the application period and at least an hour after the spraying is concluded. You may remain indoors with children and pets and cover any ornamental fish ponds, or organic gardens.
