Improve Efficiency in the Family Room

Consolidate cords-Eliminate standby electricity use by plugging the cords of computer, video game systems, and other components into a single power strip with an on/off switch.

Illuminate wisely-Replace spent incandescent bulbs with Energy Star-qualified light bulbs.

Enhance comfort-Keep your living room comfortable by keeping the temperature in check. In winter, open drapes to admit warm sunlight. Close them at dusk to trap heat. In the summer, close drapes during the day to keep out heat.
