Resident Responsibilities

The department of Public Works is determined to provide residents with improved snow removal. Snow routes will be plowed when accumulations are 1 in + on roadways.

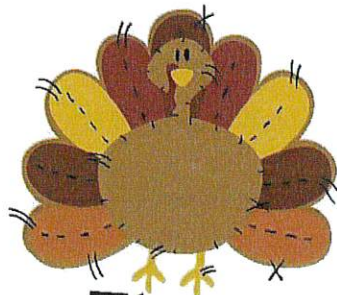
Improved services can only be achieved through a true partnership between the residents and the City. The City has invested in larger, more efficient snow removal equipment that will clear most residential streets in one pass.

All residents need to participate by moving their vehicles off the street during snow removal operations. In our experience a substantial amount of time plowing snow is removed when streets are clear of cars. Clearing streets curb to curb results in better quality snow removal with less work required after parked cars are removed. Timely plowing also minimizes the quantity of residual ice and snow on the roadway that results when compaction occurs because plowing is delayed.

Animal Control

Brush Pile Road
During construction of the new wastewater/sewer plant there may be time where the brush pile is unavailable. Please be aware of this.

All pet (dogs, cats, etc.) owners are reminded of City laws regarding no animals are allowed to run at large within the City limits which includes all public parks. Owners are required to clean up after their pets. It is unlawful for any pet to cause annoyance or disturbance to any person. Turning Off Your Utilities?

If you need to turn off your utilities, please call the City office for an appointment. The City requires a 72 hour notice before turning off your water and power, and you must be present when the utilities are turned off. Unless an emergency exists that threatens safety, Public Works and PeopleService are available for utility turn offs between 7:00 am and 3:30 pm Monday-Friday.
